## BATHING REGULATIONS NATURAL POOL HOTEL GÄNSLEIT

Please behave in and around our natural pool as you would expect other bathers to behave. To ensure that your expectations match ours, we will introduce you to our bathing rules.

## PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

## OPENING HOURS: 8am - 8pm

- In a natural pool, the bathing water is not chlorinated or chemically disinfected in any other way, but cleaned biologically on the basis of a gravel plant filter.
- Therefore, never enter the bathing facility without taking a shower first.
- Entering the bathing facility is only permitted during operating hours.
- Wearing street shoes in the bathing area and in the water is prohibited.
- · Jumping into the natural pool is not permitted.
- Please refrain from consuming food you have brought with you.
- · Avoid any contamination of the water, including going to the toilet.
- Entering the regeneration area (planting area) is not permitted.
- Smoking, eating, drinking and chewing gum are not permitted in and around the water area.
- Swimming and bathing is at your own responsibility/risk.
  The parents or their legal representatives are responsible for the children!
- . Children and young people under the age of 16 are only allowed access to the natural pool when accompanied by adults.
- · Any behavior that disrupts orderly bathing operations, violates public decency or causes annoyance is to be avoided.
- Persons under the influence of alcohol and persons with contagious diseases may not enter the facility.
- Non-swimmers are not permitted to enter the facility.
- The instructions of the lifeguards must be followed.
- People who violate the bathing rules can be expelled from the natural pool/lounge area.
- We are not liable for any theft, loss or damage to your property
- Every guest is obliged to provide the necessary first aid.

## LIABILITY:

Those responsible must report any damage or contamination to the staff immediately.

Any damage or contamination of the facilities obliges the user to pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the ABGB.

In the case of minors, the parents or their legal representatives are liable.
